Administration Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Administration presented an idea to connect Bryant MS to the Salt Lake Center for Science Education. The goal is to improve how we are serving our students and families through a collaborative effort. In the first year, the focus would be to get teachers to know each other and start to collaborate across the schools. In the 2020/19 Bryant would fully become the Bryant-SLCCSE middle school. The current SLCSE, which is 6-12, would become high school only and increase in size. There would be a comprehensive approach to student mental health/well-being. SCC/school administrators were accepting feedback on the proposal. Moving forward will require approval by the Salt Lake City School District Board.
